Message from the President—Dawn Turner

Doors Open California Visit The Monday Club with Doors Open California Sept. 9 and 10

Visit the Monday Club - A Julia Morgan Masterpiece Location featured by The California Preservation Foundation's *Doors Open California* (https://californiapreservation.org/doca/). The event is a two-day celebration of architecture and culture featuring more than 65 on-site tours and access to historic places across the state on Saturday and Sunday, September 9 and 10, 2023. The Monday Club Event is free to the public. Tours will take place 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. approximately every 30 minutes, with guest speakers from 3 - 4 p.m. each day.

A visit to The Monday Club is a unique opportunity to tour a 1934 vintage women's club designed by Architect Julia Morgan. During the first quarter of the 20th century Julia Morgan was the first woman granted an architectural license in California, the 19th Amendment granting women a constitutional right to vote was ratified by Congress, and The Monday Club was founded by a dynamic group of women in 1924. Similarly significant contributions by civic-minded women were being made elsewhere in California and in the world.

Visitors to The Monday Club will enjoy viewing original architectural features including murals, hardwood herringbone floors and the open truss system that was a recurring element in many of Miss Morgan's buildings.

New Living History Tours

Living history tours are now open to the public every 2nd and 3rd Monday, from 1-4 PM.

When you enter the iconic doors of the Julia Morgan-designed Monday Club, docents will take you back to the 1920's and 30's, when the Depression was affecting every household, prohibition was in full swing, and women had just been given the right to vote. It was a time of social, forward-thinking women dedicated to civic duty to serve their community.

You'll learn about the intersecting lives of early pioneer club members and their connection with Julia Morgan. Experience the Architecture of this very talented and overlooked woman that was awarded the first female architectural license in California, as well as the first woman to receive the certificate of architecture from The Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris, France.



The Monday Club Talking Points August 2023

The Monday Club - History

- The Monday Club was founded in 1924. The clubhouse was completed in 1934.
- The Clubhouse was designed by Julia Morgan, the 1st licensed woman architect in California who designed over 700 buildings. She designed the famous Hearst Castle.
- In 2016, Monday Club building was nominated to the National Register of Historic Places.
- In 2016 the Clubhouse underwent a \$1 M + renovation to bring it into compliance with current ADA and safety standards. We currently owe \$500,000 for the construction loan.
- The Miossi trust is currently funding the renovation of our beautiful grounds.
- The Monday Clubhouse Conservancy is a 501c3 nonprofit organization, the purpose of which is to restore and preserve the historic Monday Club.
- The programs we are most proud of include Raising A Reader, our Fine Arts Awards Program, and Lumina Alliance.

Raising a Reader

- Raising A Reader (RAR) is a national program. RAR SLO County is operated through the County Office of Education. TMC has been supporting this worthwhile program since 2014. The program fosters in young children a love of books.
- We not only get books into the hands of young children, but we donate annually to The Community Foundation who transfers these funds to SLOCOE to support RAR classrooms throughout SLO county.
- In 2023 we donated \$10,000 to The Community Foundation; total funds donated since 2015 are \$33,750.
- In the past three years a total of 11,480 books collected by the Monday Club through book drive donations.
- RAR has given away most of these books to the SLO Food Bank Summer Breakfast Bag Program and other locations countywide.

Fine Arts Award

- Fine Arts Awards have been annually since 1962, making 2024 our 63rd year of recognizing and awarding talented high school juniors and seniors from all over San Luis Obispo County.
- Today, Fine Arts Awards are judged in the categories of Classical Music, Jazz Music and Visual Arts by professionals in those disciplines. Awards totaling \$9,000 are awarded in each of the three categories.
- Some winners have used their award money to pay for college or music education programs. In fall 2023 one of our jazz finalists will continue her musical career at the prestigious Berklee College of Music in Boston.
- For the past two years, the SLO County Office of Education has funded the development of a video of the competition day.

Lumina Alliance

- Lumina Alliance provides comprehensive services to victims of domestic violence in our community. Their goal is to end sexual assault/abuse and intimate partner violence through preventive education services.
- In 2022 our members collected \$3,475 in gift cards
- Throughout the year we collect and donate requested items totaling approximately \$8000. (Items include children's clothing, bedding, back to school items, etc.)

Member Activities

- Member Monday Events including: crafts, valentines card making, fall wreath making, bow making, trivia night, charcuterie making, new member soiree, Member guest events

- In 2023 we are projected to rent the facility for 42 events totaling \$118,200 in rental fees. This does not include the 15 TMC events held.
- Building and Grounds Maintenance is approximately \$7600 per month. This
 includes, building maintenance, grounds maintenance, garbage, utilities, loan
 payments, and fire and security inspections. (This does not include Building
 Rental expenses.)

The FAA Committee met for the first time this year on August 22. We welcomed Stephanie Brazil as our Jazz lead. We developed a specific timeline for the process of informing all art, music and drama teachers as well as administrators for all public and private high schools in SLO County (not a small task) of the FAA program and how to apply, submit and audition.

The Fine Arts Awards competition will take place in the Clubhouse on Sunday, March 10, 2024.

We will again be awarding \$1500 for first place, \$1000 for second place and \$500 for third place in each of the 3 categories (visual arts, jazz and classical music).

Our fundraising for FAA has been quite successful with a carryover from last year of \$5,251.20. Since then, we have received donations of \$1,500 and 5% of Summer Sippin' for \$1,061.55. Our current balance is therefore \$7812.76. Our budget is \$9000 for the awards plus around \$1000 for expenses, totaling \$10,000. We are confident that the balance will be raised in advance of the March FAA competition.
